

CORONA VIRUS FUNERAL HOME SAFETY PLAN

QUICK CHECK

Shopping List

In the Funeral Home

- Have Lysol spray, sanitizer gel, sanitary wipes and boxes of tissues (Kleenex) in all vehicles, offices, restrooms, chapels and viewing rooms, morgue and casket selection room, etc.
- Everyone should wash hands frequently with anti-bacterial soap and dry with paper towel.
- Wipe down all door handles, toilets, sinks and water fountains with sanitizer several times during the day depending upon your traffic.
- Sick workers should stay at home

Removals

- **All removals (that are not in a body bag) should be done with a medium sized plastic bag ** placed over the face and head of the deceased. A pillow case can be used if there is no plastic bag. (I would suggest spraying the deceased's body with Lysol disinfectant at the site of removal. Be respectful - ask the family to step out while this is done.)
- Removals should always be done using universal precautions: Double gloves, mask and lab coats or gowns. Disposable gowns are best. Cloth lab coats should only be used once then washed with bleach after each use.
- Disinfect shoes and pants legs with Lysol when leaving the place of removal and the embalming / prep-room.
- Use shoe covers when possible.
- Disinfect the hearse and removal cot.

Embalming

- Embalmers should wear FULL PPE with all cases – Bunny suits with closed in foot are best.
- Embalmers should follow the regular cleansing of hands and disinfecting of shoes
- Thoroughly washed all bodies and spray with disinfectant before and after preparation.
- Mop and sanitize prep-room
- Keep trash covered
- If possible, install an extended aspirator drain hose to avoid excessive splashing during aspiration

Funeral Services

- Encourage people to not kiss or hug until this virus has abated
- Elbow bumps are a good way to pass the peace if people need or want to touch
- Encourage the use of sanitizer and tissues
- Keep facial masks in a Ziplock bag in the glove box of your limos and hearses.
- Offer masks to those who may be coughing or sneezing – *Remember: it is pollen season.*
- Wear gloves when removing used tissues and masks from your facilities and vehicles
- Lead by example

Colleagues:

This is not a fool-proof plan, but it is better than having **no plan** at all.
